

Genesis Study Guide

READ

Genesis 8:20-9:17

SUMMARY

Genesis 8-9 records the aftermath of the flood. Because Noah faithfully obeyed, God faithfully protected him and his family from His judgment. God uses Noah's family to populate the earth again, and we are reminded of God's grace to humanity. God then makes a covenant with Noah to never curse the ground again because of man's sinfulness. He seals this promise with a rainbow, a sign that reminds us of God's faithfulness.

REVIEW

Go around the room and honor one person with an encouragement or something that you are thankful for about them.

DISCUSS

- Noah gives an offering to God after the flood as an act of worship. What does this imply about our lives in response to God rescuing us from sin and death through Christ?
- God's commands are not only true and right, but they are good. Why is this important to remember as we seek to obey His Word?
- How have you seen God's faithfulness in your own life? Why do you think we fail to trust Him despite His faithfulness to us in the past?
- Throughout the Bible, God has given His people many promises that we can trust (2 Peter 1:3-4). Why are His promises important, and how do they help us to fight sin and obey Him?
