

Genesis Study Guide

READ

Genesis 11:10-12:9

SUMMARY

While Genesis 1-11 describe God's relationship with the entire world and humanity, Genesis 12-50 transition to God's focus on one particular family. In Genesis 12, God calls a man named Abram to leave behind everything to follow Him. God promises to bless Abram and to make Him into a great nation through whom He will make a people for Himself.

REVIEW

What has been the biggest takeaway for you from studying the first 11 chapters of Genesis?

DISCUSS

- Read Genesis 12:4. What is significant about Abram's response? Consider his age and other factors that might have made this difficult.
- God called Abram to leave behind everything to follow Him. What things do you have a hard time letting go or denying yourself in order to follow Christ?
- Read Hebrews 11:8-10. How would you define faith? How would you describe the relationship between faith and obedience?
- God's calling for Abram was full of promises and so is ours. Why are God's promises important and how can they help us walk in faith and obedience?
- Abram's response to God's appearance in verse 7 is to build an altar and worship. What attributes of God are you reminded of in this passage that should lead us to worship God?
